## USCAP Annual Meeting 2022

The USCAP combined a live and virtual option to the Annual Meeting this year, and a full complement of UCSF faculty and trainees returned in person to present abstracts as well as participate in many other events. Unfortunately, we couldn't host the annual department reception this year, and we missed seeing all our alums and other friends of the department in person, but we hope to be back on track for next year's USCAP Annual Meeting in New Orleans! Regardless, our department members participated in the meeting presentations in an impressive manner as in the past, with 43 abstract presentations with UCSF co-authors, totaling 35 posters (13 presented by trainees) and 8 platforms (3 presented by trainees). Multiple post-doctoral fellows also participated. The number of faculty authors from UCSF (AP and CP) involved in abstracts remained high at 40; 30 faculty were involved with 2 or more abstracts. In addition, 15 of our trainees (residents or fellows) were participants on accepted abstracts, with 6 trainees involved with more than one paper. The complete list of abstracts and other presentations is included at the end of this newsletter as an addendum for those who might be interested in seeing the broad spectrum of projects presented. Two of the trainee papers received awards (a winner and runner-up and several faculty members won awards from either USCAP or one of the Companion Societies, as listed in the Awards section of this newsletter). One of our trainees, Neil Neumann, MD, PhD, 3rd year AP resident, also was invited to do an additional presentation of his poster in a newer segment now at USCAP, "the moderated poster" session, entitled: Quantifying invasive melanoma volume by deep learning segmentation at the pixel level (Senior author T McCalmont, MD).

# Awards at USCAP

## Award presented by USCAP at the Annual Meeting 2022 to UCSF Faculty:

- **Professor Arie Perry, MD:** 2022 USCAP Harvey Goldman Teaching Award, announced at award ceremony at USCAP 2022. The Harvey Goldman Award is given by the USCAP to an exceptional individual who emulates Dr. Goldman, a luminary in GI pathology and medical education, and his achievements, attributes and contributions as mentor, educator, and diagnostician.

## Awards presented at the USCAP Annual Meeting 2022 to UCSF faculty and Trainees by Companion or Other Societies:

- **Assoc Professor Won-Tak Choi, MD, PhD:** winner of 2022 Rodger Haggitt Gastrointestinal Pathology (GIPS) Jack Yardley Investigator Award, recognizing seminal contributions or a significant body of published work that advances the field of gastrointestinal pathology. Successful candidates must be first or senior authors of publications for consideration. The award was presented at the USCAP 2022 GIPS Companion Society meeting.
- **Professor Ronald Balassanian, MD,** received the Yolanda Oertel Interventional Cytopathologist Award from the Papanicolaou Society of Cytopathology. This is an annual award started to acknowledge the contribution of pathologists to the fine needle aspiration service. The award recognizes those who promote the use of fine needle aspiration, and encourage other pathologists to utilize fine needle aspiration.
- **Emerita Professor Linda Ferrell, MD:** Hans Popper Hepatopathology Society 2022 Lifetime Achievement Award.
- **Alex Kikuchi, MD, PhD,** 3rd year AP resident and future GI/Hepatobiliary fellow: First Prize award for best abstract by a trainee in pathology from the Hans Popper Hepatopathology Society (HPPS) for his poster presented at USCAP Annual Meeting: A.T. Kikuchi, N.M, Joseph, S. Kakar. Genomic Analysis in the Categorization of Poorly Differentiated Primary Liver Carcinoma.
- **Dorukhan Bahceci, MD,** 2nd year AP/CP resident and future GI/Hepatobiliary fellow: a runner-up award for best abstract by a trainee in pathology from the Rodger Haggitt Gastrointestinal Pathology Society (GIPS) for his poster presented at the USCAP Annual meeting: Bahceci D, Lauwers G, Choi WT. Undetected dysplasia in colectomy specimens of patients with IBD is often associated with non-conventional dysplastic features, flat/invisible gross appearance, and primary sclerosing cholangitis.
- **Ruth Zhang, MD,** GI/Hepatobiliary fellow: 3rd prize for best abstract award presented at USCAP 2022 (not indicated as a trainee award) awarded by the International Association of Chinese Pathologists (IACP) for the abstract and her platform presentation: R. Zhang, G.Y. Lauwers, WT. Choi. Increased Risk of Non-Conventional Dysplasia in Patients with Primary Sclerosing Cholangitis. Associated with Inflammatory Bowel Disease
